# **Mission Statement**



# **Trauma Informed Responses for Caregivers**

Date: Thursday February 23, 2023 & Friday February 24, 2023

Time: 9:00am-4:00pm

## Content:

This is a two-day workshop will promote awareness, knowledge, and skills for the caregiver on recognizing the role implicit bias can play on behaviors which are due to trauma. Utilizing the primary components of trauma-informed care participants will be able to identify and support others who have experienced trauma, recognize, and manage personal stress associated with child welfare work and will be able to approach and relate to families in a culturally respectful and sensitive manner while promoting the potential paths of recovery.

About Our Presenters:

*Tamme Smith* has trained with OCWTP for two years, is the Founder of Mockup Training Squad, and is the coauthor of this workshop. Smith has a diverse background, including 25 years of service to the community in mental health, public education, corrections, and law enforcement. She is a Licensed Social Worker, Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor III, Certified Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) respondent, a Certified Crisis Intervention Trained Officer, and a Certified Ohio Peace Officer Trainer. Smith is a Trauma Informed Care instructor for the Lucas County Sheriff's Office Cadet Academy and The Lucas County Mental Health Service Board and a national instructor on Mental Health First Aid with the National Council.

**Dr. Marvin Whitfield** is the CEO of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northwestern Ohio, the Founder of the Blue Force Mobile Training Team, and a co-author of this workshop. Before moving to the private & nonprofit sector, Whitfield served as a Team Leader and Senior Instructor on a Department of Defense contract and conducted numerous training missions for the United States Army Intelligence Center of Excellence Training Division.

*Cynthia Thomas*, a co-author of this workshop, is a Professional Trainer, Facilitator, and Coach across Instructor Led Classrooms, Virtual, and Field platforms. Primary subjects include Leadership, Professional Development, Organizational Change, Implicit Bias, Diversity, Communications, Sexual Harassment, Stress Management, Mindfulness & Resilience. # Crisis Conversations: A Trauma Informed Care Approach

DATE: January 5, 2023 Gaines, Laura

CONTENT: Just as trauma is defined as something that is overwhelming, crisis conversations are those that may overwhelm your internal or external resources. Topics such as suicidal ideation, self-harming, rage, extreme helplessness, or violence can be overwhelming. And just as trauma is personal, a crisis conversation can be a conversation that hits us the wrong way, at the wrong time. Trauma Informed Care involves a full 360-degree approach to crisis conversations. At its most basic, a trauma-informed approach realizes the prevalence of trauma; recognizes how trauma affects all individuals involved with the system, including its own workforce; and responds by putting this knowledge into practice (SAMHSA, 2012). Having a trauma-informed response to crisis conversations includes a large set of skills that can be learned or improved upon. At the end of this workshop, you will have a crisis conversation worksheet to use in practice so that you are better prepared for the conversations to come.

## DATE: February 2, 2023 Johnston Pawel, Jody

CONTENT: See a parenting "style show" that reveals which parenting practices will get the long-term results you want. Discover the secrets for building healthy parenting habits and working together as a team with your parenting partners, including caseworkers and birth parents.

# **Behavior Management**

DATE: February 4, 2023

CONTENT: This learning, Behavior Management, is simply just that - how to manage behavioral issues. The learning goes through the continuum of behaviors that all children may present, from stealing to physical assault. The goal of this session is to provide the skills to manage these behaviors with a reduced level of reactivity. This session is recommended for anyone who works with children or manages an environment where children exhibit challenging behaviors.

# **Relax! It's Only A Crisis**

DATE: February 4, 2023 Zidar. David

CONTENT: Foster parents will learn the stages and patterns of a crisis. Participants will learn ways to manage their own behavior to improve outcomes. They will also learn professional use of their own patterns of crisis, as well as those of their families.

# Verbal De-escalation in Child Welfare

DATE: February 10, 2023 Lowery, Brian

CONTENT: This class will examine how pre-placement experiences and current stressors may affect a foster child's behavior. The skills of active listening, non-violent communication, and de-escalation will be reviewed. Levels of crisis development and the conflict cycle are discussed, emphasizing appropriate foster parent response. Trainees will participate in exercises and demonstrations concerning personal space, body posture and motion, and their cultural implications.

## Navigating the Whitewater of Reunification: Primary Family, Agency, and Foster Parent Collaboration (2.75 Credit Hours) DATE: February 10,2023 Lowery, Brian TIME: 1:00 pm -4:00 pm

CONTENT: This class will examine the complex dynamics facing birth families before, during, and after placement. While emphasizing the advantages of safe reunification of children with birth families, this training will help foster parents come to further appreciate the "biological bond," as well as challenge them to consider forgiveness as a foundation of collaborative work with parents. This workshop will also develop a framework for shared parenting, including promoting and building the "parent/foster parent team," and provide practical guidelines for such issues as visitation, phone calls, and establishing boundaries.

## **Understanding and Building Attachment**

CONTENT: This training, specifically designed for licensed foster caregivers in the early years of their foster care development, will provide participants with an understanding of how attachment develops and the four attachment styles. Participants will learn indicators for each attachment style and strategies to help children develop secure attachments. This training is part of the Fundamentals of Fostering series.

# The Effects of Fostering

DATE: March 11, 2023

CONTENT: This training, specifically designed for licensed foster caregivers in the early years of their foster care development, will assist participants in identifying what factors contribute the most to their stress as caregivers and what strengths they bring to caregiving. They will learn to identify indicators they, or someone in their family, may be experiencing burnout or secondary traumatic stress. Strategies to prevent or mitigate the stress of caregiving will also be addressed. This training is part of the Fundamentals of Fostering series.

# **Engaging Primary Families**

Dr. Christine TIME: 9:00 am - 4:00 pm CONTENT: With the passing of the Federal Law - Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2014, child welfare agencies have been tasked to help foster caregivers make decisions to allow foster youth to have experiences on par with peers who are not in foster care. The law is a departure from the conventional belief that foster youth should not engage in some activities that would be normative for most children of their same age. This workshop seeks to shed light on what is the Reasonable and Prudent Standard and what

agency staff and foster parents should do to help youth develop socially and emotionally while ensuring compliance with the law.
